# **2026 IBA All-State Band Guest Conductor**

## **Dr. Rodney Dorsey**

Rodney Dorsey is Professor of Music at the Florida State University College of Music where he conducts the FSU Wind Orchestra and guides the graduate wind conducting program.



Dr. Dorsey comes to FSU from the Indiana University Jacobs School of Music where he conducted the IU Wind Ensemble and taught graduate conducting courses. Prior to his tenure at the Jacobs School, Dorsey served on the faculties of the University of Oregon, University of Michigan, DePaul University and Northwestern University. He also gained extensive experience teaching in the public schools of Florida and Georgia.

Dorsey studied conducting with Dr. Mallory Thompson, Mr. John P. Paynter, and Dr. James Croft. He was a clarinet student of Mr. Fred Ormand and Dr. Frank Kowalsky.

During his conducting career, he has led performances at several prominent events including the American Bandmasters Association Convention, College Band Directors National Conference North/Northwest Regional Conference, and the Bands of America National Festival. He is active as a guest conductor, clinician, and adjudicator in the United States. International engagements include Hungary, Canada, and Bulgaria.

His commitment to community has been demonstrated by his participation on the board of directors for Music for All and the Midwest Clinic. He currently serves as the president of the Midwest Clinic. Other professional memberships include the College Band Directors National Association, National Association for Music Education, Florida Bandmasters Association, Kappa Kappa Psi, Tau Beta Sigma (honorary), Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia, and Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity Incorporated. Dorsey is also an elected member of the American Bandmasters Association. Most recently Dorsey was named a Yamaha Master Educator.

# 2026 IBA All-State Honor Band Guest Conductor

## Michael Haithcock

Michael Haithcock retired from his duties as director of bands and professor of music (conducting) at the University of Michigan in May of 2023 after twenty-two years of distinguished leadership which followed his twenty-three years in the same role at Baylor University. Following in the footsteps of William D. Revelli and H. Robert Reynolds at UM, Professor Haithcock conducted the internationally renowned University of Michigan Symphony Band, guided the acclaimed band and wind ensemble graduate conducting program, and provided administrative leadership for all aspects of the University of Michigan's diverse and historic band program.

Under Haithcock's guidance, the UM Symphony Band received a wide array of critical acclaim for their high artistic standards of performance and the quality of their repertoire. These accolades came from concert reviews at national and state conventions, performances in major concert venues such as Carnegie Hall in New York City, Walt Disney Concert Hall in Los Angeles, and a variety of performances presented during the Symphony Band's May 2011 tour of China, as well as recordings on the Albany, Arsis, and Equilibrium labels. Reviews of the ten commercial CD's he recorded with the U-M Symphony Band between 2002 and 2018 stated, "programming and execution of this caliber ought to be available worldwide...musically impressive, giving a sense of elation." The American Record Guide praised the "professional manner with which the group delivers...they show great skill and artistry" and proclaimed the "sound of the U-M Symphony Band is something to savor." The University of Michigan Symphony Band's YouTube channel is also a highly respected and utilized resource for bands around the world as well as an important archive of his artistic accomplishments while director of bands at U-M.



Professor Haithcock is highly regarded as a master teacher. In February of 2012, he was named an Arthur F. Thurnau Professor by the University of Michigan which is the University's highest award for excellence in undergraduate teaching. He is the author of the *Elements of Expressive Conducting*, a widely adapted textbook for conducting classes in universities around the world. Forty-four masters and doctoral conducting students studied with him at UM and serve important positions in prestigious music schools across the country, including three who lead band programs at BIG TEN institutions. He is in constant demand as a guest conductor with professional ensembles, major universities, all-state groups and other festival ensembles, as well as serving as a resource person for conducting symposiums and workshops in a variety of instructional settings.

A graduate of East Carolina University, where he received the 1996 Outstanding Alumni Award from the School of Music, and Baylor University, Haithcock has done additional study at a variety of conducting workshops including the Herbert Blomstedt Orchestral Conducting Institute. The *Instrumentalist*, the *Michigan School Band and Orchestra Association*, *The School Musician*, the *Southwest Music Educator*, and *Winds Magazine* have published his articles on conducting and wind literature. He has also provided forwards for a number of books by respected colleagues in the field.

Professor Haithcock is an elected member of both the music honor society Pi Kappa Lambda and the American Bandmasters Association. He remains active in the College Band Directors National Association following his term as president (2001–2003) and received the organizations Lifetime Achievement Award in 2021. In 2011, he was awarded the Distinguished Service to Music Medal by Kappa Kappa Psi National Honorary Band Fraternity.

# **2026 Indiana Gamma Chapter, Phi Beta Mu Outstanding Bandmaster Katy Briel**

Katy Briel is in her 23rd year as Band Director currently at Clark-Pleasant Middle School in Greenwood, IN where she teaches all middle school bands and assists with the Whiteland Community High School Marching Band & Leadership Team. Before her position with the Clark-Pleasant bands, Katy was band director at Lincoln Junior High School in Plymouth Indiana for 2 years.

For the past 12 years, Katy has been the band director coordinator for the Drum Corp International INpact Band: Indiana's Future Band of middle school students that perform at DCI World Championships in Indianapolis each year. She is also a part of the expansion for the DCI Bandtastic weekends across the country. She is a member of the Leadership Staff for the Crossroads Drum Major and Leadership Clinic and was a staff member for the Indiana Ambassadors of Music where she has been a director on 4 European tours and on staff for the Indiana Musician's Abroad 2023/2025 European tours as well.

Ms. Briel is the co-coordinator for the Indiana Junior All State Band and the Membership Coordinator for the Indiana Music Education Association. Ms. Briel also serves on the ISSMA State Board and is a member of Phi Beta Mu. Katy also served at the 2024 Music for All Summer Symposium with the Middle School Concert Band Track. She was named the 2024-2025 Indiana's Music Educator of the year through NFHS and the 2025-2026 Indiana Music Educator of Excellence through IMEA.

In addition to her passion for teaching, she enjoys living a life of service and was a 2013 TOMS shoe ticket-to-give winner which led her to a giving trip at Hogar de Ninos Emanuel in San Pedro Sula, Honduras. Katy received her bachelor's degree in music education from Ball State University in 2004. In addition to being a band director, she loves playing her horn and has an active private lesson horn studio on the south side of Indianapolis where she resides with her husband and 2 dogs Watson & Oliver. Her husband Josh is a trombone player and in Indy's New Orleans Style Brass Band.

### **Phi Beta Mu – Gamma Chapter**

Phi Beta Mu is the highest honorary international band director's fraternity. It was organized to encourage the building of better bands and the development of better musicians in schools throughout the world and to foster deeper appreciation of good music and more widespread public interest. Gamma Chapter of Phi Beta Mu was organized and the charter members initiated on November 27, 1953, at the state convention of the Indiana Music Education Association.

Terry Collins was one of the ten 1956 graduates from Corey High School (now part of Clay City). His future unfolded with the recommendation of the Township Trustee, who shared that Terry would be an excellent music teacher because of his devotion to his musical ability, as he performed with his band during halftime of the basketball games in which he was a player on the team. Terry followed that recommendation and obtained his bachelor's degree at Indiana State Teachers College and completed his master's degree at Indiana State University.



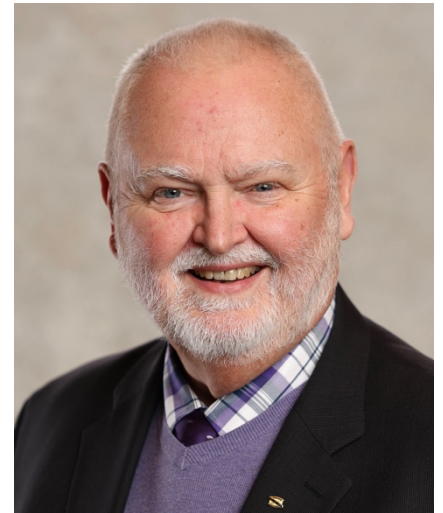
Immediately after college, Mr. Collins's first teaching assignment was at Wheatfield High School. In 3 years, he was asked to come to Knox High School as the Band Director, and he remained there for 8 years. Dr. Hathaway, from Lewis Cass High School, learned of Terry's accomplishments and contacted Mr. Collins to request that he come to Walton to create a Band Program. In the next 22 years, Mr. Collins was able to give over 1,000 students the music experience of a lifetime. While the school music associations in Indiana evolved and consolidated, Lewis Cass High School was part of the Marching Band Finalists every step of the way, including a Class C Championship in 1988. The band students were blessed with many experiences in musical performances at locations such as New Orleans Mardi Gras Parades, The Grand Ole Opry stage in Nashville, TN, Chicago Bears Football game, Disney World in Orlando, FL, Indy 500 Parade, and even an international band competition in Canada.

Terry Collins led by example, serving in different capacities in the statewide music organizations NISBOVA and ISMA which finally consolidated into today's ISSMA. He served as President, on the board of directors, and, as an adjudicator for the organizations. He also taught a Marching Band Technics Course at Marion College (Indiana Wesleyan University).

# 2026 Indiana Gamma Chapter, Phi Beta Mu Hall of Fame Myron Snuffin

Myron Snuffin is an accomplished music educator with a career spanning over five decades. He retired as Director of Bands at Brownsburg East Middle School and Middle School Performing Arts Chair for the Brownsburg Community School Corporation in 2020 after 42 years in the position. BCSC has been named a Best Community for Music Education by the National Association of Music Merchants (NAMM). Prior to coming to Brownsburg, he taught at South Putnam Jr/Sr High School and South Knox Jr/Sr High

Mr. Snuffin began his musical journey in Salem, Illinois where his band director was the legendary Gene Stiman. He then attended Plaza Park Elementary in Evansville, Indiana with band director, Emery Nagy and he graduated from Evansville Harrison High School where his band directors were Robert Donaldson and Bruce Langford. He received a Bachelor of Music Education degree from the University of Evansville, and a Master of Science degree in Music Education from Indiana State University, with additional graduate work at Southern Illinois University - Edwardsville. He is a member of the Indiana Music Education Association, National Association of Music Education, Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia and Phi Beta Mu (International Band Directors' Fraternity).



His Brownsburg Eighth Grade Band and Jazz Bands were selected to perform at the National Association of Middle Schools Annual Conferences in 1999, 2004 and 2009. Brownsburg Kiwanis named him a middle school teacher of the year. BCSC recognized him with the Golden Apple Award and a Professional Contributor Award as a corporation in-service presenter.

Mr. Snuffin was a zone representative on the Indiana State School Music Association State Board. He has served as Secretary/Treasurer for the Indiana Bandmasters Association since 1997 and is secretary of Phi Beta Mu Gamma Chapter (Indiana). He has also served IBA as an All-Region and All-District Honor Band Host and Guest Conductor, District II Representative and All-Region Honor Band Commission Chairperson. He is a Past President of the Alliance for Indiana Music Education. He continues to help beginning band students as an Instrument Advisor for Paige's Music.

# Indiana Bandmasters Association

## Purpose

1. To stimulate interest in the study of the band and its literature.
2. To develop a desire for good band literature.
3. To encourage good fellowship between the members of the Association.
4. To bring the work of the Association before the Indiana Department of Education and the citizens of the State in order that it shall gain greater recognition and support.
5. To provide educational meetings for band directors to raise the standards of instruction.
6. To secure recognition of School Administrators and Boards of Education to the effect that the band is an integral part of the school curriculum and is entitled to recognition as a curricular subject.
7. To develop a band in each community which shall serve as a vital force in bringing people into closer relationship with the schools of the State.
8. To assure that no person on the basis of race, color, religion, national origin or ancestry, age, sex, marital status, sexual orientation, or disability be discriminated against, is excluded from participation in, denied the benefits of, or otherwise be subjected to discrimination in any program or activity of the organization.

## History

Founded in 1953, the Indiana Bandmasters Association would initially engage in sponsoring a Marching Band Clinic, an All-State Band, and act in an advisory capacity for Indiana Music Education Association (IMEA) on band activities. The first Marching Band Clinic was organized in the fall of 1956 and continued each year through the summer of 1979. IBA would sponsor its first All-State Band in 1961 with John Paynter as the guest conductor. The event went to two ensembles, the All-State Band and the All-State Honor Band, in 1980. The first Junior High All-Region Bands were organized in the fall of 1980 at three sites. As interest grew the number of sites was increased to the current fifteen. In 1994 the event was renamed the All-Region Honor Band Festival.

The first IBA commission was premiered at the 1988 All-State Honor Band concert with the composer, Robert Jager, conducting. The Association premiered the first junior high commission by John O'Reilly at the All-Region Festivals later that fall. The winter of 1995 saw the first collaboration of the Indiana chapter of the College Band Directors' National Association (CBDNA) and IBA to sponsor the Indiana All-Collegiate Honor Band. The group now is formed biannually to perform at the Indiana Music Education Association Professional Development Conference.

In 1999 IBA established All-District Honor Bands for students in grades nine through twelve, performing at six sites in the fall of 2000. The first All-District Band commission, by Robert Sheldon, was premiered in the fall of 2005. IBA now commissions at least one new work for concert band each school year.
